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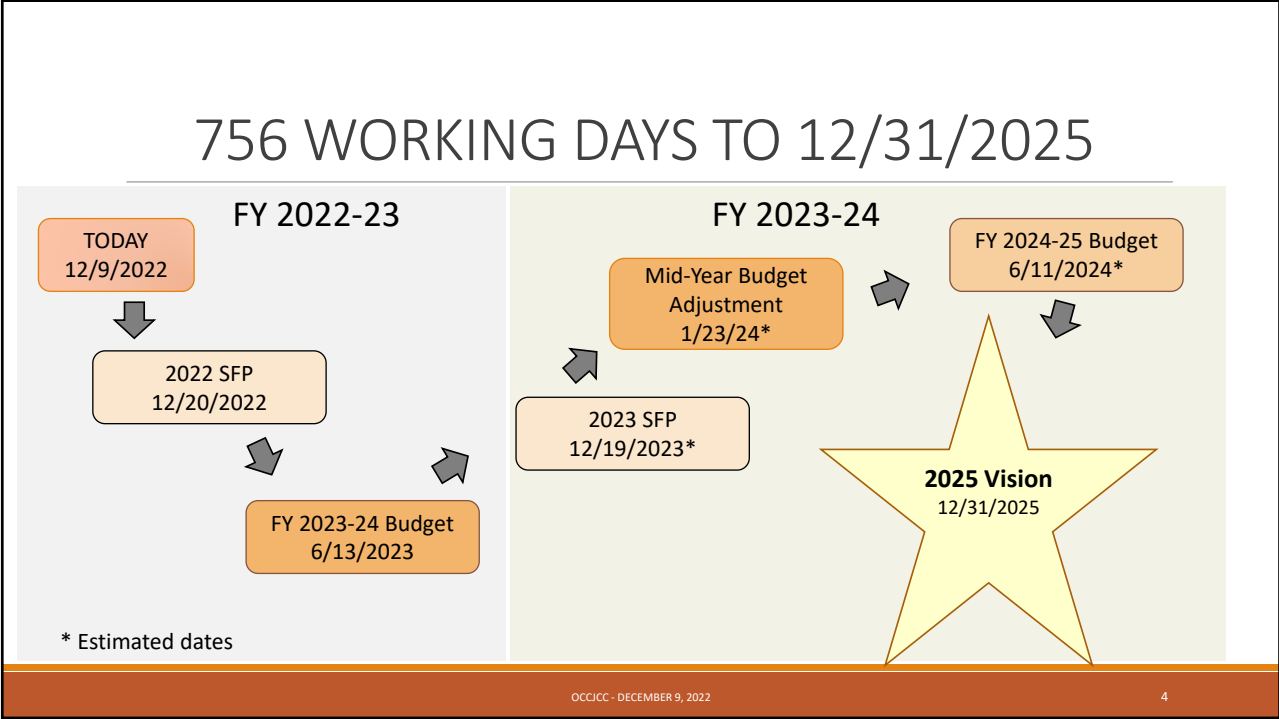

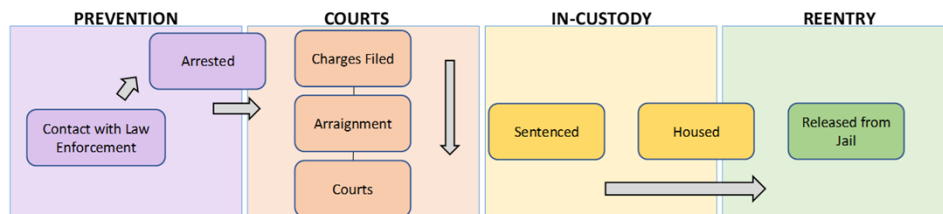

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**CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM
(Adults)**



Communication & Media Campaign: Inform public, community partners and individuals involved in the justice system of the services and programs available and how to access them.
Data Gathering & Analysis: Obtain data and metrics for reportable outcomes and performance indicators.
Comprehensive Care Coordination: Includes outreach and engagement and care management for justice-involved individuals to adhere to their treatment plans.

SOCDIS & MDT: Data sharing for coordinated care management by the multi-disciplinary teams (MDT).
CIT Training: Crisis Intervention Training (CIT) for first responders and dispatchers.
Be Well Facilities: Establish the 2nd of 3 co-located BH facilities.
BH Public Safety Response Team: Provide specialized BH response team and follow up.
FIRST Point: Diversion program post-arrest and in lieu of charges filed.

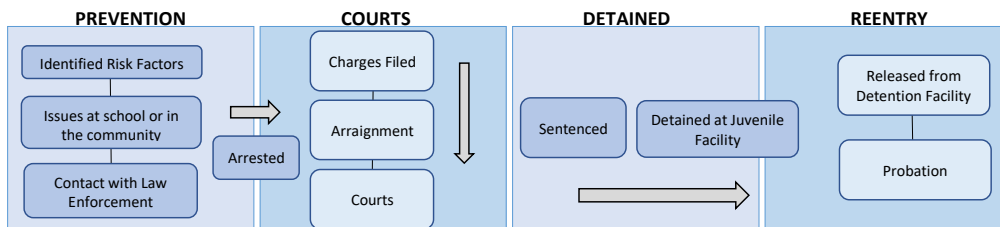
Pre-Trial Intervention: Post-arrest diversion program with court-ordered treatment.
Care Court: New court supporting seriously impaired individuals per SB 1338.
Expand Specialty Courts: Increase current capacity and develop new courts to best address community needs.

SOCDIS & MDT: For MDTs to develop discharge treatment plans.
CIT Training: For custodial deputies with enhanced training for assignments in specialized housing.
Specialized Housing: Housing modules for specific populations in the jails with specialized programming.
In-Custody Stabilization Services: Robust MH and substance use treatment program with dedicated MH housing for individuals with acute MH issues.
Enhance Inmate Programming: Programming and training to prepare for reentry – including at the new Musick Jail Facility.

SOCDIS & MDT: Revise and monitor individual's progress.
Regional Reentry Centers: Provide linkages to treatments, services or programs.
Mobile Reentry Services: Equipped vehicles deployed to various areas making reentry services and resources easily accessible.
Central Reentry Center: Provide coordinated care management,
Workforce Reentry Center: Hands-on job training that would lead to employment, viable career and self-sufficiency.

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**JUVENILE JUSTICE SYSTEM
(Youth, Juveniles, TAY)**



Targeted Communication & Media Campaign: Inform public, community partners and individuals and families involved in the juvenile justice system of the supportive services and programs available and how to access them.
Data Gathering & Analysis: Obtain data and metrics for reportable outcomes and performance indicators.

Juvenile Mental Health & Substance Use Support Services: Residential and outpatient treatments for youth, juveniles, and TAY to address mental illness and substance use to prevent involvement in the juvenile justice system.
Youth Diversion Programs: Programs to address underlying issues or risk factors that may lead to involvement in the juvenile justice system.

Expand Juvenile Specialty Courts: Increase current capacity and develop new courts to best address needs of the juveniles and TAY populations and their families.

Juvenile Mental Health & Substance Use Support Services: Treatments for youth, juveniles, and TAY detained to address mental illness and substance use.
Specialized Programming for Detained Juvenile/TAY: Enhanced programming to detained youth to address specific needs pertaining to education, life and social skills, and vocational needs.
Enhance Juvenile Correction Campus: Modern Juvenile Facility based on evidence-based and best practices that provides flexibility with evolving populations.

Specialized Reentry Programs: Unique services and programs for the juvenile and TAY populations to promote self-sufficiency.
Supportive Housing: Ensuring sufficient housing options exist for placement with necessary supportive services.
Transitional TAY Housing: Temporary housing for TAY involved in the juvenile justice system pending placement into more stable housing.
