Veterans Committee Orientation and Overview

- On August 24, 2022, the CoC Board approved the creation of the Veterans Committee.
- The Veterans Committee meetings will serve as a space to share updates on efforts of the Orange County CoC to prevent, reduce, and end homelessness for veterans.
- The Veterans Committee will provide leadership on the issue of veteran homelessness and coordinate efforts to better serve veterans and their families.
- The CoC Board approved the Veterans Committee Governance Charter at the January 2023 meeting of the CoC Board, which detailed representatives to be included in the committee membership.



Homeless Veterans on Veteran Registry




Currently, there are 254 veterans on the Veteran Registry including 235 veterans experiencing homelessness. In the previous 12 months, 242 veterans have been housed in permanent, stable housing. Over 30 agencies, including the VA Community Resource and Referral Center, outreach providers, and shelter providers, continue to meet weekly to coordinate housing and services for veterans experiencing homelessness in Orange County. In the past 12 months, there has been an 1% increase in the number of veterans experiencing homelesness in Orange County.

VA Data and Updates

Current Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing (VASH) Data

- 115 vouchered & searching VASH Veterans
- 12-16 orientations are being completed per week to voucher additional Veterans
- Two project-based VASH buildings opening within the next 4-5 months
- Tahiti (Stanton) 10 units
- North Harbor (Santa Ana) 34 units
- Three additional project-based VASH building opening between the end of 2023 and beginning of 2024

Veterans Committee Charter and CoC Board Leadership Vision

- At the January 2023 meeting of the CoC Board, the CoC Board approved the Veterans Committee Governance Charter.
- The Veterans Committee Governance Charter includes language that aligns with the CoC Board Leadership Vision and commitment to racial equity efforts as part of the Racial Equity Roadmap action planning implementation.

Purpose: The Veterans Committee (Committee) will function as an advisory group to the CoC Board and align its efforts to those of the Orange County CoC Board Vision. This Committee aligns with the intent of ensuring that the CoC is actively working to prevent, reduce, and end homelessness for veterans, and measuring progress on these efforts. The Committee will provide leadership on the issue of veteran homelessness and coordinate efforts to better serve veterans and their families in becoming permanently housed and achieving housing stability.
