HOUSING RESOURCES

Immediate


- Available 24 hours a day
- Ongoing availability
- Low threshold, minimum to no eligibility criteria

Emergency and Temporary Housing

- Not immediate available, may require referral and/or evaluation of eligibility criteria
- Provides short to medium term housing option, but not permanent
- Generally considered to be entry points to a broader array of housing programs and supportive services

Permanent Housing

- May provide short to medium term rental assistance
- May provide an ongoing rental subsidy
- Permanent housing with indefinite duration, whereby the participant has a leasing and/or rental agreement
- Often paired with supportive services
