## EMERGENCY HOUSING

Provides immediate emergency housing to single youth aged 18 to 24, experiencing homelessness, who are able to work. Case management and mentoring are included in the program.

Provides shelter and supportive services to youth ages 18-24, who are at-risk of homelessness or experiencing homelessness in Orange County, including Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Intersex, and/or Questioning (LGBTIQ+) and sex-trafficked youth.

Provides support and guidance for youth ages 18-24 to become self-sufficient. The program includes affordable living in an apartment and participants are required to work and are encouraged to attend college. Youth are supported through housing and case management for up to 24 months.

Orangewood also offers transitional housing for young women ages 18-25 affected by sex trafficking. Youth are supported through housing, case management, and therapeutic programming for up to 24 months.

## STREET OUTREACH

#### Hours: Monday - Friday 9 AM – 2 PM

Provides street outreach to youth without housing. Outreach counselors assist with information and resources regarding housing, education, employment, medical, mental health and other supportive services. Food, clothing, counseling and hygiene products may also be provided. The program targets youth who may be living on the streets, are afraid of going to a shelter or being sent home, or may have a police record and are fearful of incarceration.
