


Transitional Age Youth (TAY) Data Overview

- The data being reviewed today is extracted from the Orange County Homeless Management Information System (HMIS).
- HMIS is a shared database utilized across service providers in Orange County.
- Though it is widely used, specifically by CoC-funded agencies, it is one of multiple databases used by service providers to input data, share data and track performance outcomes.

TAY Active in Coordinated Entry System Overview – May 2023




HMIS TAY Data Trends 2020 - 2023

Youth Homelessness Demonstration Program (YHDP) Overview



Due Date for Application: June 27, 2023



Available funding amount: \$60,000,000



Expected to award 25 communities



Grant Terms

Communities will have 6 months to submit a coordinated community plan, if/when announced as awarded

HUD and Program-Specific Goals and Objectives

The Orange County Continuum of Care (CoC) application should align with the following highlighted goals outlined in the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) Strategic Plan:

Goal 1: Support Undeserved Communities

- > Strengthen support for undeserved communities
- > Support equitable community development for all people

Goal 2: Advance Housing Justice

> Strengthen support for vulnerable populations, underserved communities, and Fair Housing enforcement

Goal 3: Reduce Homelessness

> Strengthen Federal, State, Tribal, and community implementation of the Housing First approach to reduce the prevalence of homelessness, with the goal of ending homelessness

Goal 4: Invest in the Success of Communities

➤ Promote equitable community development that generates wealth-building for underserved communities, particularly for communities of color

Target Population

The target population to be served under YHDP includes:

- Unaccompanied Youth persons who are age 24 or younger, who are not part of a family (household with at least one adult and one minor child).
- **Pregnant or Parenting Youth** Individual heads of households who are age 24 or younger who are pregnant or who are the parents or legal guardians of one or more children who are present with or sleeping in the same place as that youth parent.
- Transition Age Youth persons between age 18 and 24
- Literally homeless persons:
 - individuals and/or families who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence, which includes one of the following:
 - Place not meant for human habitation
 - Living in a shelter (Emergency Shelter, hotel/motel paid by government or charitable organization)
 - Exiting an institution

Youth Action Board Integration – 20 Points

Community Need – 25 Points

Collaboration – 20 Points

Youth Collaboration – 25 Points

Data and Evaluation Capacity – 10 Points
