SUMMARY ACTION MINUTES

MEMBERS; THE COLD WEATHER SHELTER AD HOC AND IDENTIFYING POTENTIAL MODELS FOR COMING COLD WEATHER SEASON; THE NEWLY FORMED TINY HOMES AD HOC HAS FIRST MEETING SCHEDULED IN JANUARY 2024; AND THE ENCAMPEMNT REOSLUTION FUNDING, A HOMELESSNESS SERVICES GRANT OPPORTUNITY FROM THE STATE, WITH APPROXIMATELY \$300,000,000 AVAILABLE TO CITIES, COUNTIES, AND CONTINUUMS OF CARE WITH AN APPLICTAION DEADLINE OF JUNE 2024. WITH RESPECT TO COLD WEATHER EMERGENCY SHELTER PROGRAM, COMISSIONER IVINS PROVIDED DIRECTION TO STAFF TO FURTHER EXPLORE, NEGOTIATE, AND IMPLEMENT PLANS FOR A COLD WEATHER EMERGENCY SHELTER PROGRAM WITH THE TWO CORRESPONDING CITIES AND THEIR FAITH-BASED COMMUNITES WHILE CONTINUING TO EXPLORE OTHER OPTIONS AS WELL.

PRESENTATION

7. 2024 Point in Time Count

MATT BATES, EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT WITH CITY NET PRESENTED AN OVERVIEW OF THE 2024 POINT IN TIME COUNT PROCESS. EMPHASIZED THE POINT IN TIME COUNT (REQUIRED BY THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT) IS INTENDED TO CAPTURE A SNAPSHOT OF HOMELESSNESS DURING A POINT IN TIME RATHER THAN CAPTURING HOMELESSNESS IN ORANGE COUNTY ANNUALLY OR USING ANOTHER TIMEFRAME. SPOKE ABOUT THE IMPORTANCE OF VOLUNTEERS TO ASSIST IN COMPLETING THE POINT IN TIME COUNT IN A VARIETY OF ROLES.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Carrie Buck – Oral re: Executive Director of Family Solutions Collaborative; appreciates efforts being made to assist families, prevention is key; about 40 families reach out throughout the year requesting referrals for a second time; data is kept and tells the story; shared two instances of families that Family Solutions could not assist and ultimately fell into homelessness. Appreciates focus on prevention to do everything possible to prevent homelessness.

Cold Weather Emergency Shelter Ad Hoc

- The Ad Hoc was established and is comprised of a member of the Board of Supervisors, city managers from two Orange County cities, and local law enforcement leaders.
- The Ad Hoc recognized the impacts of hosting large congregate shelter sites and the opportunity for multiple smaller sites to operate during the cold weather months.
- The Ad Hoc discussed various Cold Weather Emergency Shelter models and as part of the evaluation process is interested in hearing from each Orange County Mayor and City Manager on the following:
 - The needs of the city during the winter months, and
 - Potential model or site where a city is willing to host a Cold Weather Emergency Shelter that is proportionate to the need of their city.
- A letter has been sent to all 34 cities to explore available options and operational models for the Cold Weather Emergency Shelter.

Cold Weather Emergency Shelter Ad Hoc

- Following the October 2023 meeting, the Commissioners have taken steps to follow up with the cities.
- Six cities have responded to the Office of Care Coordination.

Tiny Homes Ad Hoc

- The goal of the Ad Hoc is to evaluate alternative housing solutions, including studying, defining and identifying potential applications for Tiny Homes.
- The first meeting has been scheduled for January 2024.

Homelessness Grant Opportunity

- The California Interagency Council on Homelessness (Cal ICH) is accepting applications for \$299 million in the Encampment Resolution Funding (ERF) Round 3 grants.
- The goal of ERF is to assist Local Jurisdictions in ensuring the safety and wellness of people experiencing homelessness in encampments; resolve critical encampment concerns and transition individuals into safe and stable housing; and encourage a data-informed, coordinated approach to address encampment concerns.
- These competitive grants are available to cities, counties and Continuums of Care, and applications
 will be accepted on a rolling basis until June 30, 2024, or until funds are exhausted.
- To date, 66 communities have been awarded \$414 million from the ERF since its inception in 2021.

2024 Point in Time Count



What is a Point In Time Count?

A National Movement. Everyone Counts OC is part of a national effort to better understand homelessness. The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) requires all 400+ Continuum of Care jurisdictions across the nation to complete a biennial unsheltered count and an annual sheltered count of all individuals experiencing homelessness in the community at a single "point in time".



Why do a Point In Time Count?

Everyone Counts OC is an opportunity to collect current information on homelessness in our community, including:

- Number of people experiencing homelessness in Orange County
- Where homeless neighbors are located
- Robust demographic information
- Subpopulation information on groups such as Veterans, Transitional Aged Youth, and Families.



The Data is Useful

The survey data helps the Orange County CoC and the County of Orange respond more effectively to homelessness in Orange County.

With the collected data, the homeless service system can:

- Accurately assess the demographics and locations of those in need
- Make informed decisions on housing and shelter interventions (where, what types, and how many)
- Collaborate more closely—from coordinating street outreach and engagement to partnering on case management to shelter operation to housing and supportive services
- Advocate for state and federal dollars to fund interventions

Sheltered and Unsheltered Count

- Sheltered Count: sunset on Monday, January 22, 2024, to sunrise on Tuesday, January 23, 2024
- Unsheltered Count: Tuesday, January 23, 2024, to Thursday, January 25, 2024
 - Survey-based count, goal is to survey all people experiencing unsheltered homelessness
 - Volunteer surveyors visit pre-identified "hotspots" where people experiencing homelessness are expected to gather
 - Surveyors deployed from local deployment centers to all 34 cities, plus unincorporated areas (~400 maps in all)
 - Access centers for Families and Transitional Age Youth



Volunteer Opportunities

Team Captains:

- Responsible for building and leading a team of two to three surveyors in the field.
- Responsible for navigating maps, knowing emergency and safety protocols, and understanding the Survey123 smartphone application and Survey/forms.
- Required to attend a two-hour live or video conference training.

Field Surveyors:

- To be placed within a team consisting of a Team Captain and up to three additional Field Surveyors.
- Required to complete training either live or via pre-recorded training.

Deployment Center Volunteers:

- Will assist with setting up or cleaning up the Deployment Center in increments of two-hour shifts.
- Will assist with greeting field volunteers and guests, providing vehicle traffic control, distributing T-shirts and mapping supplies, receiving supplies when field volunteers return from their shift and help with clean-up duties.
