# **Orange County 2024 Point In Time Count (2024 PIT Count)**

 The County of Orange in partnership with the Orange County CoC conducted the sheltered count the night of Monday, January 22, 2024. The unsheltered count process took place over three days, Tuesday, January 23, 2024, through January 25, 2024.



The 2024 PIT Count identified a total of 328 veterans who served in the U.S. Armed Forces,
 National Guard or Reserves.

# **Comparison of Orange County 2022 and 2024 PIT Count**

• In comparison to the 2022 PIT Count, the veterans subpopulation increased by 17.14% in the 2024 PIT Count.

# **Orange County 2024 PIT Count**

- During the unsheltered PIT Count, those surveyed who identified as having served in the U.S. Armed Forces, National Guard or Reserves (Veterans) were asked for additional identifying information to ensure follow up and further connection to services.
- For further coordination of targeting and outreaching to unsheltered Veterans, Volunteers of America, Los Angeles (VOALA) was provided survey data collected during the 2024 PIT Count of all those surveyed who stated they were a Veteran.
- VOALA staff then made efforts to engage and provide connections to services.

# Targeted Outreach for Veterans

- Collaborative working: Veterans Affairs (VA), Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF), Care Coordination, Outreach
- Case conferences every 2 weeks on specific 3 groups
  10+ years homeless, over 62 years old or families with at least one minor
- Data monitored from July 2023
- Shelter and / or Hotel offered to Veterans
- Extra support while in temporary accommodation and to find housing
- Ongoing support if temporary accommodation is not accepted

# Veterans that have been homeless 10+ years

- 20 total clients
- 7 housed
- 5 out of 7 were in temporary accommodation prior to housing
- 4 currently in temporary accommodation
- 5 have been removed from BNL due to no contact
- 4 actively working with



Inflow vs. Outflow by Month




Currently, there are 183 veterans experiencing homelessness on the Veteran Registry. In the previous 12 months, 207 veterans have been housed in permanent, stable housing. Over 30 agencies, including the VA Community Resource and Referral Center, outreach providers, and shelter providers, continue to meet weekly to coordinate housing and services for veterans experiencing homelessness in Orange County. In the past 12 months, there has been a 24% decrease in the number of veterans experiencing homelessness in Orange County.

#### Coordinator for Coordinated Entry System (CES) for Survivors Request for Proposals (RFP)

- The County of Orange's Office of Care Coordination is seeking proposals from qualified organizations to serve as the Coordinator for the CES for Survivors for all three Service Planning Areas (SPA) - North, Central, and South - in Orange County.
- The CES for Survivors Lead will promote regional service coordination within and across SPAs, ensure alignment with the CES requirements, and lead strategic imitative and collaborative efforts that facilitates access to the System of Care, primarily housing resources.
