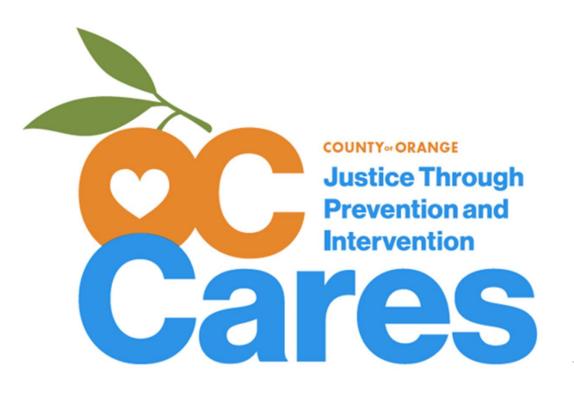

OC Sheriff Department

Focus on Re-entry Upon Entry

- Treatment of Mental Health and Substance use Disorders
- 65% of the IRC is now dedicated to mental health housing
- LPS beds increased from 15 to 45
- Vocational Training
- Warm handoff to post custody services / availability of services immediately upon release

Correctional Health is a multi-disciplinary team working collaboratively with Sheriff's department and outside stakeholders to address the various health needs of the incarcerated.

Behavioral Health (BH) Public Safety Response Teams/PERT Teams

Created in 2019 to prioritize which OCSD calls require behavioral health follow-up with PERT clinicians. As a result to this pilot program with OCSD, PERT is now in a total of 36 cities, including all cities and unincorporated areas OCSD has agreements with.

Medi-Cal Mobile Crisis Benefit

A State requirement to have two person teams, be available 24/7, have a 60-minute response time, be training to administer naloxone, standardized dispatch and procedures responsive to both youth and adults, and more.

OCSD/OC Links 911 Diversion

This collaborative is aimed at improving emergent responses for individuals experiencing a behavioral health crisis. All OCSD 911 Dispatchers underwent CIT and shadowed OC Links Behavioral Health Navigators.

Behavioral Health Outreach & Engagement (O&E)

coordinated outreach to engage individuals into the Care Plus Program, available 7 days a week, and collaboration with the CAT/PERT teams, OC Links, cities and community partners.

Expanded Partnership and Collaboration with Justice Partners (Long Term & Immediate):

- Development of CJ1 (2009) pathway to CJ2(2024)
 - Early Intercept model for early triage of SUD & MH
- Stepping Up Initiative evolution to OCCARES
 - Identified Juvenile and Court Pillars
- Response to Fentanyl/Opioid Crisis
- Creation of Response with Project Kinship to Jail Releases

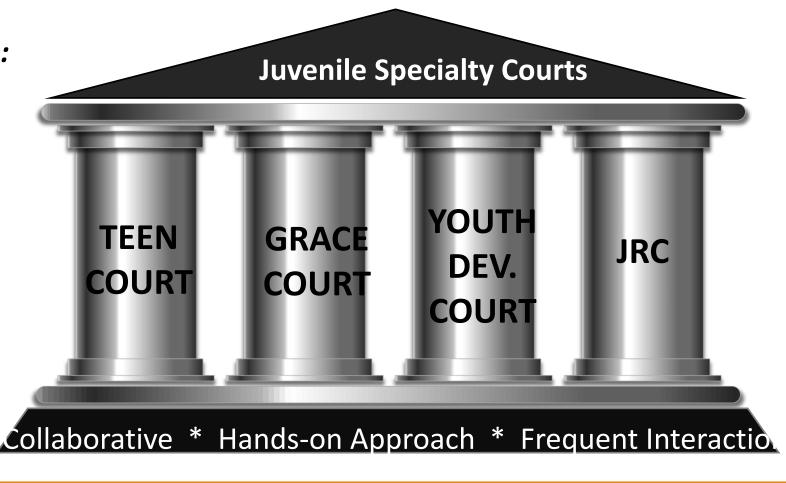

Expand Juvenile Specialty Courts:

- Maximize the benefits of existing specialty courts
- Develop and implement additional specialty courts
- Address specific needs of Juvenile and TAY population





Crossover Youth Court (CYC)

Family Treatment Court



Began working with Georgetown University (Early 2021)

Launched the court in March of 2022 (Every other Wednesday)

The most vulnerable population in juvenile court

Currently exploring ways to expand the court due to case numbers

OC Superior Court Collaborative Court

Supervising Judge: Scott Cooper

- Implemented and refined data tracking to identify capacity issues and anticipate future needs
- Working collaboratively with County partners to expand adult treatment courts to accommodate increased referrals
 - Pretrial diversion programs growing most rapidly, particularly Mental Health Diversion
- Collaborating with the state (Judicial Council) and County to design and acquire space for a new courthouse dedicated to adult treatment courts

OC District Attorney

- OCDA's FIRST Point program launched in April 2022 with our partners OCHCA, SSA, and three pilot law enforcement agencies: OCSO, Irvine PD, and Seal Beach PD.
- Over the last two years, we have referred over 60 individuals to the First
 Point program. We recognized there was a gap in the referral process when
 the assigned HCA clinical team was unable to locate the individuals to
 provide services.
- In recent months, we have strengthened our partnership with the OC Outreach and Engagement team.
- Since working with the OC O & E team, we have provided them with 19 OCSO First Point referrals.



Connecting to Public Benefits

- <u>Pre-release</u>: apply for low/no-cost health insurance and—only in Orange County—food benefits
- <u>Post-release</u>: apply for other benefits
- County Multi-Disciplinary Team reviews individual cases for eligibility
- SSA also connects Transitional Age
 Youth with housing, education, and a support network



Community Partner: CalOptima Health

90-Day Pre-Release Pilot for Enhanced Care Management (ECM)



- ECM is part of CalAIM, California's effort to transform Medi-Cal by integrating social support services that serve the whole person
- As part of the pilot, ECM providers will go into the jails to provide ECM services to the incarcerated individuals for up to three months prior to release. Goals are to:
 - Build rapport between the individuals and the team who will support them post-release.
 - Ensure the individuals have care plans, necessary referrals and medical appointments set up so they can fully use their Medi-Cal benefits upon release.
- CalOptima Health will seek Board of Directors' approval of a Notice of Funding Opportunity for a limited number of ECM providers to receive special funding to participate in the pilot.
 - During the pilot, providers will work out the details of how pre-release services are best administered to improve the level of future success for full implementation post-pilot.
 - Goal is to have ECM providers chosen and ready to serve by the end of the year.
















System of Care Data Integration System

SOCDIS

Care Plus Program

• The Care Plus Program offers enhanced care coordination for those who are the most vulnerable

across the County's System of Care.

• The program consists of two components:

1. System of Care Data Integration System (SOCDIS)

- 2. Multidisciplinary Team (MDT)
- The program has two objectives:
 - 1. Expediting the identification of client needs
 - 2. Providing subsequent linkages to services with greater collaboration, maximization of resources and fewer delays in care coordination












SOCDIS


• The System of Care Data Integration System (SOCDIS) integrates numerous County databases to create a consolidated virtual client record. This technology solution facilitates data sharing between County departments and community-based organizations and provides a platform to create client care plans and track progress.





Multi-Disciplinary Team

• SOCDIS creates one Virtual Client Record with a client's demographics, program history and service utilization. Interdepartmental data and information sharing is then facilitated by a Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT) which meets twice a month to coordinate care for high utilizers accessing County services/programs. High utilizes are defined as those found in four or more databases across source systems.










Virtual Client Record (VCR)






VCR - Client Demographics






VCR – Program Overview










Program Enrollment










VOA Case Note






VCR - County Jail










VOA Case Note




VCR - Correctional Health






HCA Correctional Health Case Note



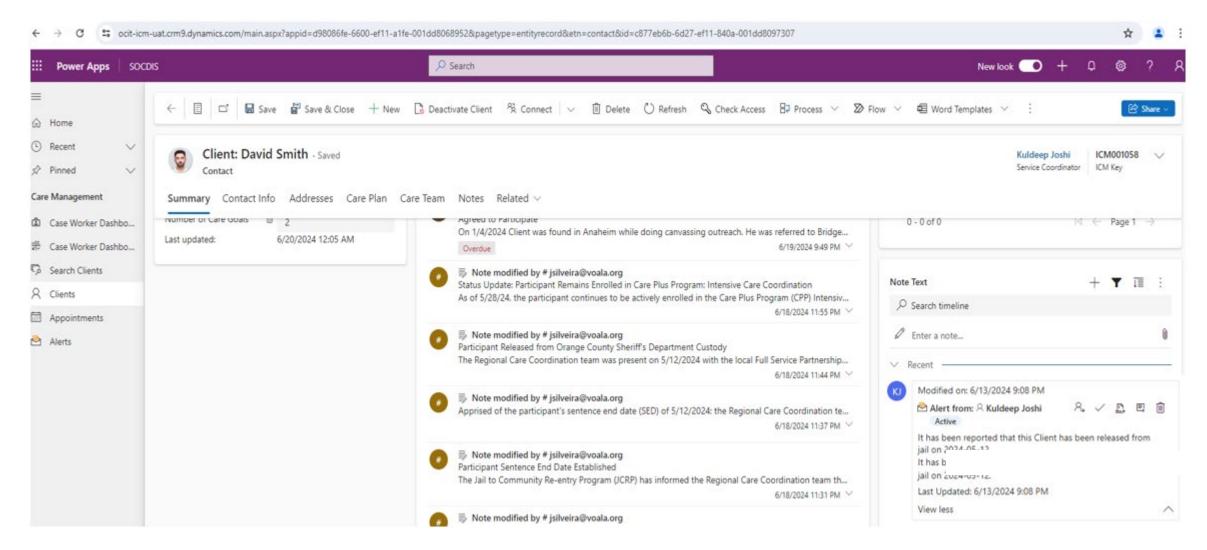

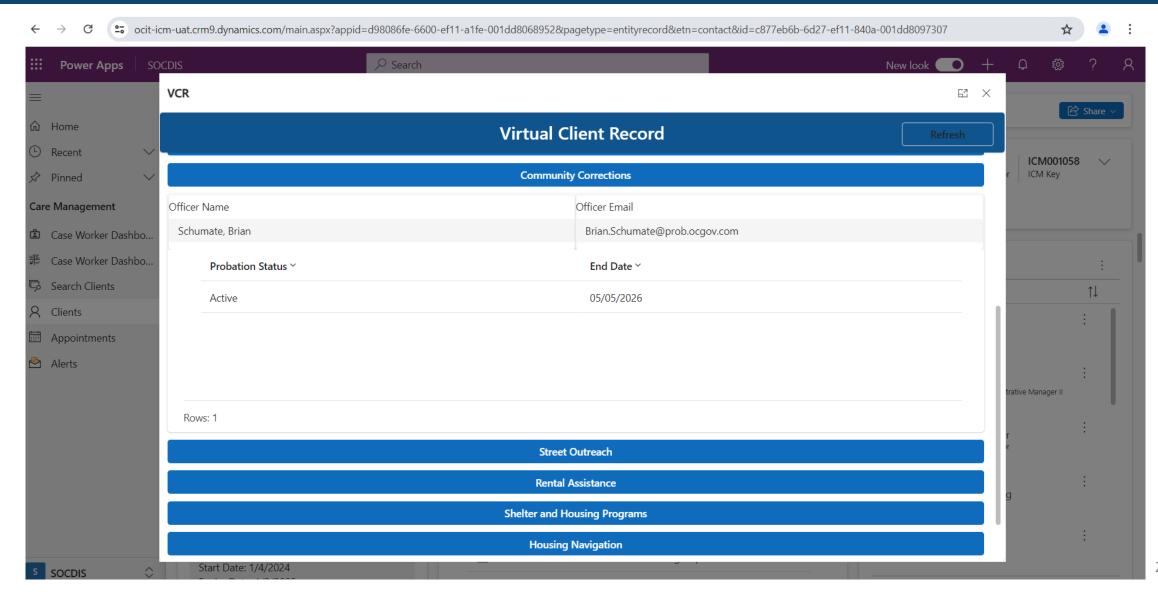

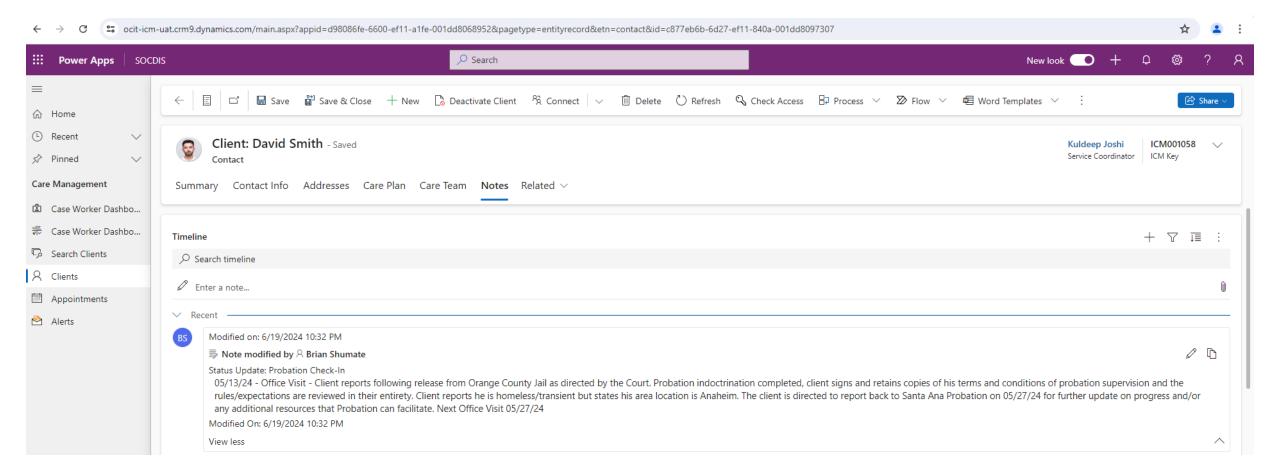


VCR - Community Corrections



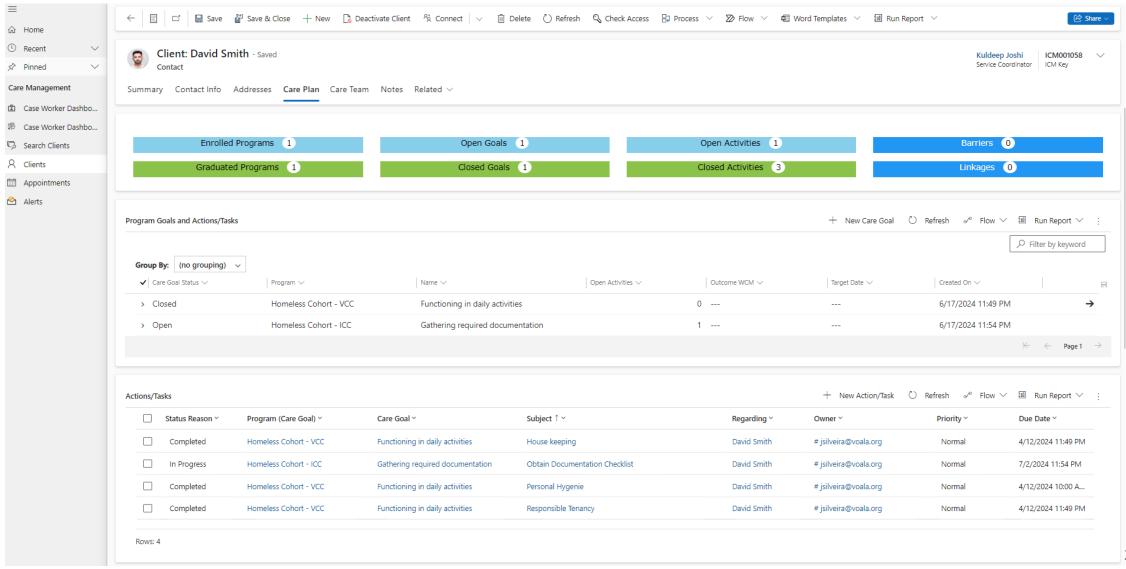


Probation Case Note



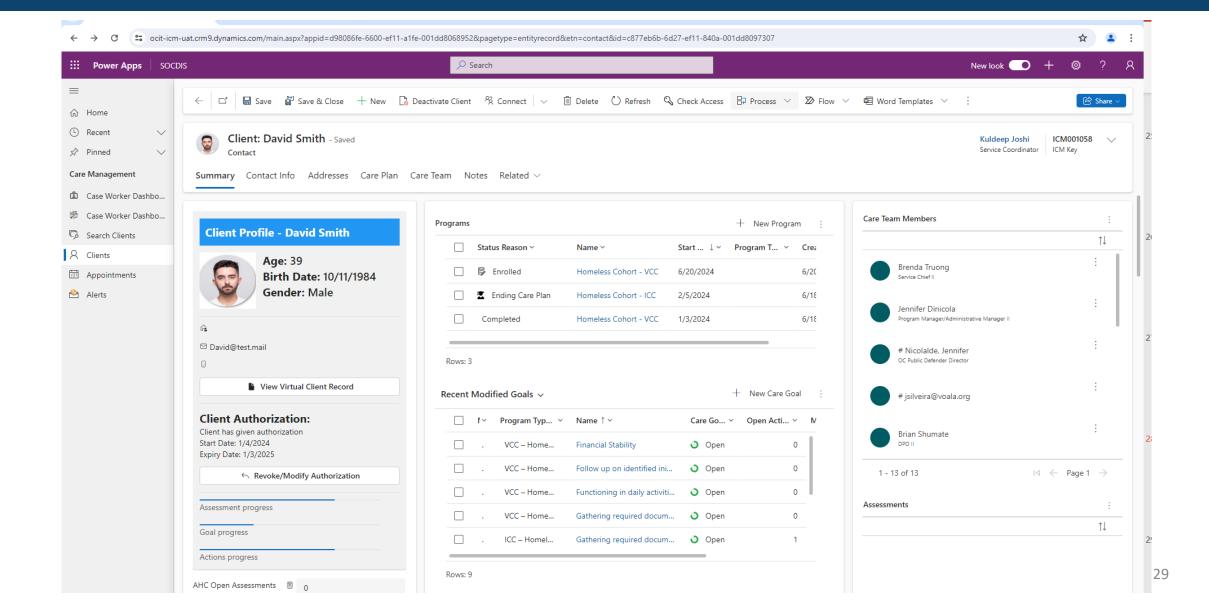
