I am aligned with all of the goals however, as an advocate for housing options and services for youth experiencing homelessness, the two that resonate the most with me are Promote an Equitable, Just System and Smartly Allocate Funds to Address the Greatest Needs.

I believe that promoting an equitable, just system and allocating funds based on greatest needs enable a holistic approach that acknowledges the intersectional factors contributing to homelessness for the different types of individuals and families that need access to services. I envision myself contributing to these goals by being involved in different working groups and chairing committees that align with these priorities.

Please discuss one (1) significant challenge to addressing homelessness in Orange County. If you could wave a magic wand to address this challenge, what would your solution be?

A significant challenge in addressing homelessness in Orange County is recognizing and understanding the diverse ways it manifests among different subgroups, particularly young adults. If I could wave a magic wand to address this, I would expand the HUD definition of homelessness and adjust the criteria for chronic homelessness for individuals aged 18-25. This modification would ensure that young adults are prioritized within systems of care, allowing for more tailored and responsive support for this vulnerable population.
