

OPPOSITION TO REDUCTION OF DEFENDANT'S FELONY CHARGES PURSUANT TO PENTAL CODE SECTION 17(B)

"In supporting and enacting the recent legislative amendments under Prop. 36, the public made its voice clear; the revolving door of misdemeanor narcotics convictions serves no interests and only exacerbates ongoing public health and safety crises..... Therefore, no justice is furthered by sentencing defendants to plead to misdemeanor convictions, bypassing the opportunity to enroll in and removing any incentive to participate in meaningful treatment."

- □ OCDA began offering 200-hour drug treatment program as a diversion option on November 8, 2024, to incentivize treatment in advance of Prop. 36 going into effect.
- ☐ Cases Submitted 908
- ☐ Cases Filed 757 (83.37%)
- ☐ Guilty Plea Felony 128 (16.9%)
- ☐ Guilty Plea Misdemeanor 27 (3.57 %)
- ☐ Reduced to Misdemeanor by Court 53 (7%)

ONLY NINE DEFENDANTS HAVE PLED INTO A TREATMENT PROGRAM

Cases Submitted – 245 Cases Filed – 160 (65.31%)

Guilty Plea – Felony – 29 (18.13%)

Guilty Plea – Misdemeanor – 12 (7.5 %)

Reduced to Misdemeanor by Court –13 (8.13%)

Prop. 36 December 18, 2024 – February 14, 2025

- Dispensed with original OCDA5-year washout guideline
 - All HS 11395s based on case review will be filed regardless of remoteness of priors
- Filing opposition to 17(b) motion in every case where a 17(b) request is made
- ❖ Filing opposition to terminal disposition in every case where court is inclined to give a terminal disposition, with or without 17(b)






Penal Code Section 11395 Treatment Mandated Felony

In lieu of jail, state prison or probation with jail, a defendant may elect treatment.

A treatment program may include drug treatment, mental health treatment, job training, and any other conditions related to a successful outcome for the defendant.




















Legal Impediments

PROPOSITION 36

The Office of Care Coordination began attending Prop 36 court on January 31, 2025. Through collaborative work with the Courts, 42 individuals are actively being tracked to identify any episodes of homelessness.

Resources regarding homeless services are being offered and contact information for staff at the Office of Care Coordination.

PROPOSITION 36 DATA



- 30 out of the 42 individuals have identified previous history of homelessness in Orange County.
- 17 individuals have prior history of enrollment into emergency shelter programs.
- 15 individuals have engaged with the Office of Care Coordination during court hearings.
- Five (5) consent forms have been signed for the Care Plus Program.
- Three (3) individuals have identified interest in going into shelter upon their release.

Homeless Court Resource Fair

The Office of Care Coordination attended the Homeless Court Pop-Up Resource Fair in Chula Vista to learn more about how San Diego county is providing resources and assistance to people experiencing homelessness who are criminal justice involved.

The San Diego County Collaborative Partnership engages various resources from substance use disorder rehabilitation programs, Child Support Services, Homeless Court and its justice partners, and more in a single location to provide those experiencing homelessness with direct access to the Homeless Court Program, State and County services, and Community-Based Organizations.

The Office of Care Coordination is currently working to align resources in Orange County to host a similar event.
