Collaboration among teams of stakeholders



OUTREACH

HAVE YOU SERVED IN THE USS MILETVARY?

If so, you may be eligible for special services for Veterans. This includes Veterans Treatment Court.

- This program helps combat and non-combat Veterans who have trauma, mental health issues, or substance abuse problems arising from from their military service (including PTSD, traumatic brain injury, or military sexual trauma).
- In this program, Veterans get the treatment, accountability and support they need instead of going to jail.
- The treatment focuses on helping these Veterans deal with their trauma, mental health, and/or substance abuse issues.
- If they complete the program successfully, their charges might be dropped, and their arrest and court records might be sealed.
- Eligibility does not depend on discharge status.

If you are interested, inform your lawyer or the Court. Request to be set for a Veterans Treatment Court evaluation.







RESTORING HOPE, EMPOWERING LIVES, BUILDING A SAFER COMMUNITY



Collaborative Courts are special programs that help people with mental health or substance abuse problems. These programs offer treatment and support instead of traditional sentences (such as jail). If someone finishes the program successfully, they do not face any jail time or fines/fees, and their charges might be dismissed.

If you are interested, inform your lawyer or the Court.

DUI Court: For people who have multiple DUI charges and an alcohol use disorder. This program provides treatment, accountability, and supportive services to help them stop drinking and live healthy, productive lives.

Drug Court: Helps people who are addicted to drugs and need treatment. The program provides treatment, accountability, and supportive services to help them stop using substances, improve ther lives, and have the future they want.

> ntal Health Courts: These courts help people with serious mental health issues that may have tributed to their legal problems. Participants get "wrap-around" treatment, supervision, and a supportive services to deal with their mental health and other issues and help them thrive.

Military/Veterans Courts: These courts help current and former service members who are struggling with mental health and/or substance use isses due to their military service. This includes PTSD, traumatic brain injuries, sexual trauma, substance use disorders, or other problems. The programs provide treatment, accountability, and supportive services as alternatives to jail. Eligibility isn't based on discharge status.

Homeless Outreach Court: Helps people who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless by resolving minor legal issues and fines. As part of the program, participants are connected with supportive services to improve their quality of life and achieve stability.





CURRENT CCB COURTS





