Call to Order

CHAIRMAN SARMIENTO CALLED THE MEETING TO ORDER AT 1:05 P.M.

Pledge of Allegiance

VICE CHAIR CUNNINGHAM LED THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE.

Roll Call

CLERK CALLED THE ROLL AND CONFIRMED QUORUM.

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PUBLIC COMMENT

Ken Baer – Was looking at the current membership roster and noticed there is a vacancy for the Lived Experience Representative and would like to be considered for the seat; previously experienced homelessness in Orange County; has achieved a bachelor's degree from UCLA and has been focused on addressing homelessness and homeless service delivery; believes he can provide insightful contributions to the Commission.

COMMISSION MEMBERS COMMENTS

Commissioner Hurst – Recently learned his seat is coming up for renewal; provided insight into church partnerships and stated he believes churches are the unsung heroes in combating homelessness; thanked the Commission for the opportunity to serve and believes the right people are at the table and great things can happen in addressing homelessness.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

1. Certificates of Recognition

Certificates were presented to Commissioners Sean DeMetropolis, Jack Toan, and Paul Wyatt upon the conclusion of their service to the Commission; the Commission extended their collective and profound gratitude for their contributions and insights in addressing homelessness.

- 2. Commission to Address Homelessness Update
 - a. Bylaw Revision Updates
 - Commission Director Doug Becht presented an update on the bylaw revisions, which were approved by the Board of Supervisors during the February 25, 2025, meeting.
 - b. Membership Ad Hoc
 - A new Membership Ad Hoc has been established to recruit members in accordance with the new bylaws; Commissioners provided insights and suggestions in the recruitment and application process.
 - c. 2024 Commission Ad Hocs
 - Commission Director Doug Becht recognized all the great work of the Ad Hoc Committees, and many have now closed as their work has been completed.
- 3. Office of Care Coordination Update
 - a. 2025 Orange County Supportive Housing NOFA

Orange County Community Resources (OCCR) released the 2025 Orange County Supportive Housing Notice of Funding Availability (2025 NOFA) which includes over \$12 million of Federal Home Investment Partnership American Rescue Act Plan Program (HOME-ARP) funds, Mental Health Services Act funds, and 150 housing choice, mainstream or VASH (Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing) project-based vouchers. OCCR incorporated in the 2025 NOFA that small-scale housing unit proposals will be considered, provided the criteria and the guiding principles of the Small-Scale Housing Unit Report are met.

- b. 2025 Homeless Survey
 - Office of Care Coordination, working with City Net, completed the 2025 Homeless Survey; 840 surveys were collected, and the Office of Care Coordination hopes to bring results of the 2025 Homeless Survey to the Commission this summer.
- c. OC Same Day Solutions Fair
 - On March 27, 2025, the Office of Care Coordination hosted the first OC Same Day Solutions Fair at the Second Baptist Church in Santa Ana; representatives from various County agencies, state government agencies, non-profits, community organizations, vendors, and volunteers provided services and resources; the District Attorney and Public Defender assisted in dismissing charges and/or clearing warrants on minor offenses related to homelessness that can hinder the ability to obtain stable housing; each person on average received between two to three services; the Office of Care Coordination hopes to host another event, possibly in South County or North County; Chairman Sarmiento thanked Pastor Pitts for making his church available, not just for this event but for many community events and services.
- 4. Commissioner Spotlight Commissioner Adam Hawley, Chief of Police, Brea

Commissioner Hawley highlighted the Hope Center, which was launched as a collaborative effort in which law enforcement entities throughout North Orange County provide meaningful homelessness outreach and engagement; eight out of twelve cities have onboarded to the Hope Center which include Stanton, Cypress, La Palma, Buena Park, Fullerton, La Habra, Placentia, and Brea; last year the Hope Center saw almost 8,000 calls and 4,500 client engagements; the Hope Center is currently funded through 2027.

- 5. Federal Legislative Update presented by Peter DeMarco, Director of Legislative Affairs, County Executive Office and Cori Takkinen, Townsend Public Affairs, Inc.
 - Presentation provided information on the impacts to federal funding resulting from various executive orders, including significant layoffs to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) made by the Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE); a number of housing programs, grants and regulatory actions are being impacted; the Homelessness Fraud and Corruption Task Force (Task Force) was recently created by newly appointed U.S. Attorney Bill Essayli; the Task Force will investigate crimes related to the misappropriation of funding allocated towards the eradication of homelessness in the Central District of California, as well as fraud schemes involving the theft of private donations intended to support services for homeless populations.
