As of April 30, 2025, there are **235** veterans experiencing homelessness on the Veteran Registry. In the previous 12 months, **138** veterans have been housed in permanent, stable housing.

Over 30 agencies, including the VA Community Resource and Referral Center, outreach providers, and shelter providers, continue to meet weekly to coordinate housing and services for veterans experiencing homelessness in Orange County.

In the past 12 months, there has been a **12%** decrease in the number of veterans experiencing homelessness in Orange County.

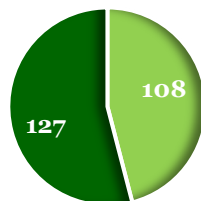

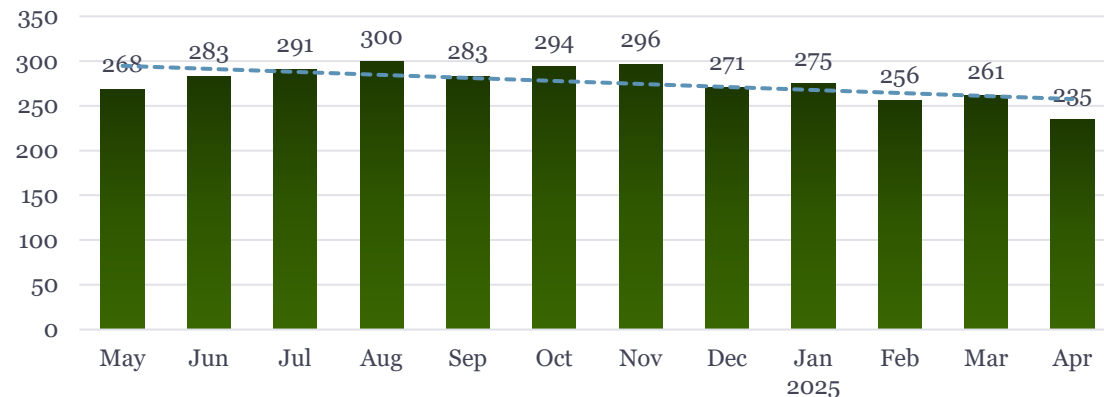


## Community Queue Status

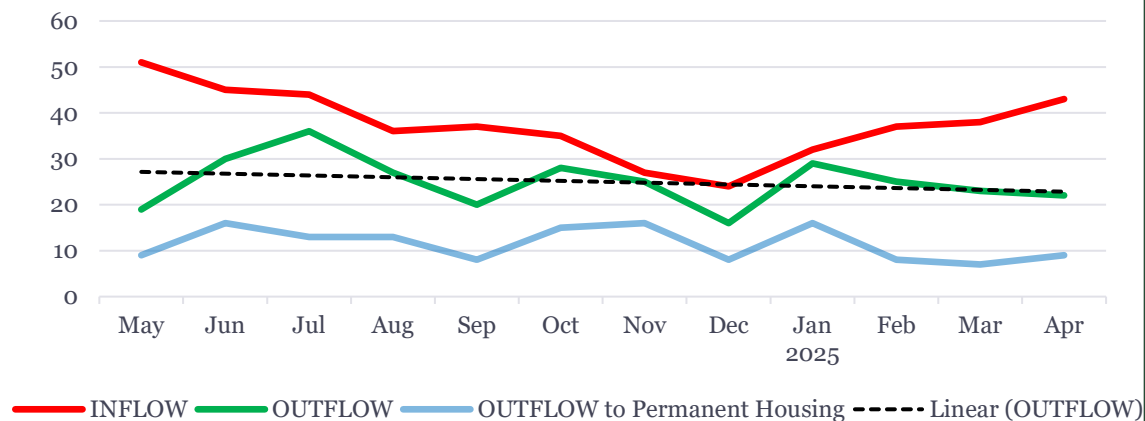
