- I. **Call to Order/Introductions/Opening Remarks:** Meeting called to order by OCCJCC Chair Supervisor Andrew Do. Supervisor Do provided opening remarks regarding Governor Gavin Newsom's Legislative Secretary Anthony Williams attending the meeting to learn more about OCCJCC and its goals.
- II. **Review and Approval of Minutes:** Meeting Minutes of October 17, 2019, were approved unanimously.
- III. **Review and Approval of 2020 Meeting Calendar:** 2020 Meeting Calendar was approved unanimously.
- IV. **Updates on Integrated Services Strategy:** Supervisor Do directed the OCCJCC to provide an annual report to the Board of Supervisors with updates and progress.

Additionally, Supervisor Do confirmed the 2025 Vision to be a working model and requested any changes to the Goals, Scope, or Action Items be reported and discussed with the OCCJCC. Kim Engelby, County Executive Office acknowledged and praised County agencies for the collaborative efforts put into the coordination of the Integrated Services Strategy (ISS) model and provided status notes and updates

- a. *Orange County Integrated Services Strategy Updates*: Presentation lead by Kim Engelby; updates were provided as an attachment.

Leaders of the three working groups provided their updates:

- a. Courts: The Courts/Criminal Justice Working Group is facilitated by CEO. Its focus is the individuals diverted through court processes or through the specialty courts.
- b. Reentry: The Reentry Working Group is led by Bryan Prieto, Probation, and Kim Engelby, CEO Budget. This working group's focus is on individuals having benefits/linkages to services in place upon release.
- c. Legislation: The Legislation Working Group is facilitated by Peter DeMarco and works to support the other working groups on identifying legislative strategies to address the challenges identified by those groups. Updates were provided as attachments.

The working groups cover all areas addressed in the County's 2025 Vision and are meeting regularly to address, create and complete action items. As such, the need for OCCJCC to meet as a large group is better addressed on a quarterly basis, provided progress is demonstrated through the working groups.

Supervisor Do and Sheriff Don Barnes briefed Governor Newsom's Legislative Secretary Anthony Williams regarding OCCJCC's history and its goals.

Anthony Williams noted that Governor Newsom is looking at criminal justice and probation at large. The goal is to treat root causes for individuals coming back into the criminal justice system and to provide wraparound services for the Transitional Aged Youth (TAY) group at the state level.

- V. **OCCJCC Comments:** Public Defender Sharon Petrosino announced Dan Cook retired, and Martin Schwarz is the new Chief Deputy Public Defender.
